Sigmund freud quotes about life

Sigmund Freud is considered to be the father of psychoanalysis, a clinical method for treating psychopathology through dialogue between a patient and a psychoanalyst. He managed to explore the human mind more thoroughly than any other before him and his contributions to psychology are vast. Freud's life work was dominated by his attempts to find ways of penetrating the subtle and elaborate camouflage that obscures the hidden structure and processes of personality. Freud elaborated his theory of the unconscious and went on to develop a model of psychic structure comprising id, ego and super-ego. He developed therapeutic techniques such as the use of free association and discovered transference, establishing its central role in the analytic process. His analysis of dreams as wish-fulfillments provided him with models for the clinical analysis of symptom formation and the underlying mechanisms of repression. Freud redefined sexuality to include its infantile forms led him to formulate the Oedipus complex as the central tenet of psychoanalytical theory, and postulated the existence of libido, an energy with which mental processes and structures are invested and which generates erotic attachments, and a death drive, the source of compulsive repetition, hate, aggression and neurotic guilt.
